

ONEIDA CUP FOR ADELAIDE.

P. H. Adee Teaches Young Skippers Tricks in Yacht Racing.

The New York thirty-footer Adelaide scored a notable victory, her first of the season, when she won yesterday afternoon in the Indian Harbor tournament race the Oneida Cup, offered by Commodore E. C. Benedict. She defeated W. D. Guthrie's Maid of Meudon in a close race in the morning in the semi-final by 1:51, and followed it up by beating Hanan Brothers' crack Nautilus, which had previously won over Cord Meyer's Atair, in the closest race of the tournament. She was sailed in both instances by Phillip H. Adee, who showed the young skippers who have been winning races all season that they had something yet to learn about handling a Herreshoff racer.

There were three races in the series sailed during the day. In the morning the three winners of Thursday and the Maid of Meudon, which drew a bye, were paired and raced in the semi-final. Adee Brothers' Adelaide met Maid of Meudon, and Cord Meyer's Atair drew Hanan's Nautilus. The latter pair was sent away first, and sailed over a nine and a half mile course to windward and return. Nautilus, sailed by Phillip Mallory, took the lead at the start and never was headed.

Then the Adelaide got the start of the Maid of Meudon and led her to the windward mark by over a minute, and increased her advantage on the run home to 1:51.

In the afternoon the wind had freshened and the course was lengthened to eleven miles, starting from the gas buoy off Great Captain and going to Matincock Point and return. On the beat out, the boats took the long starboard tack to the Long Island shore and the port tack to the mark. The Adelaide fetched and turned 0:32 ahead of Nautilus, which had to make a short ten seconds' hitch to round. On the five-and-one-half-mile run home the Nautilus picked up 0:38, but the Adelaide still had 0:14 to spare to win. Summary:
